Our commencement speaker was Judge Dick Jones of Oklahoma City and the sermon was delivered by Reverend A. Max Holcomb of our city.

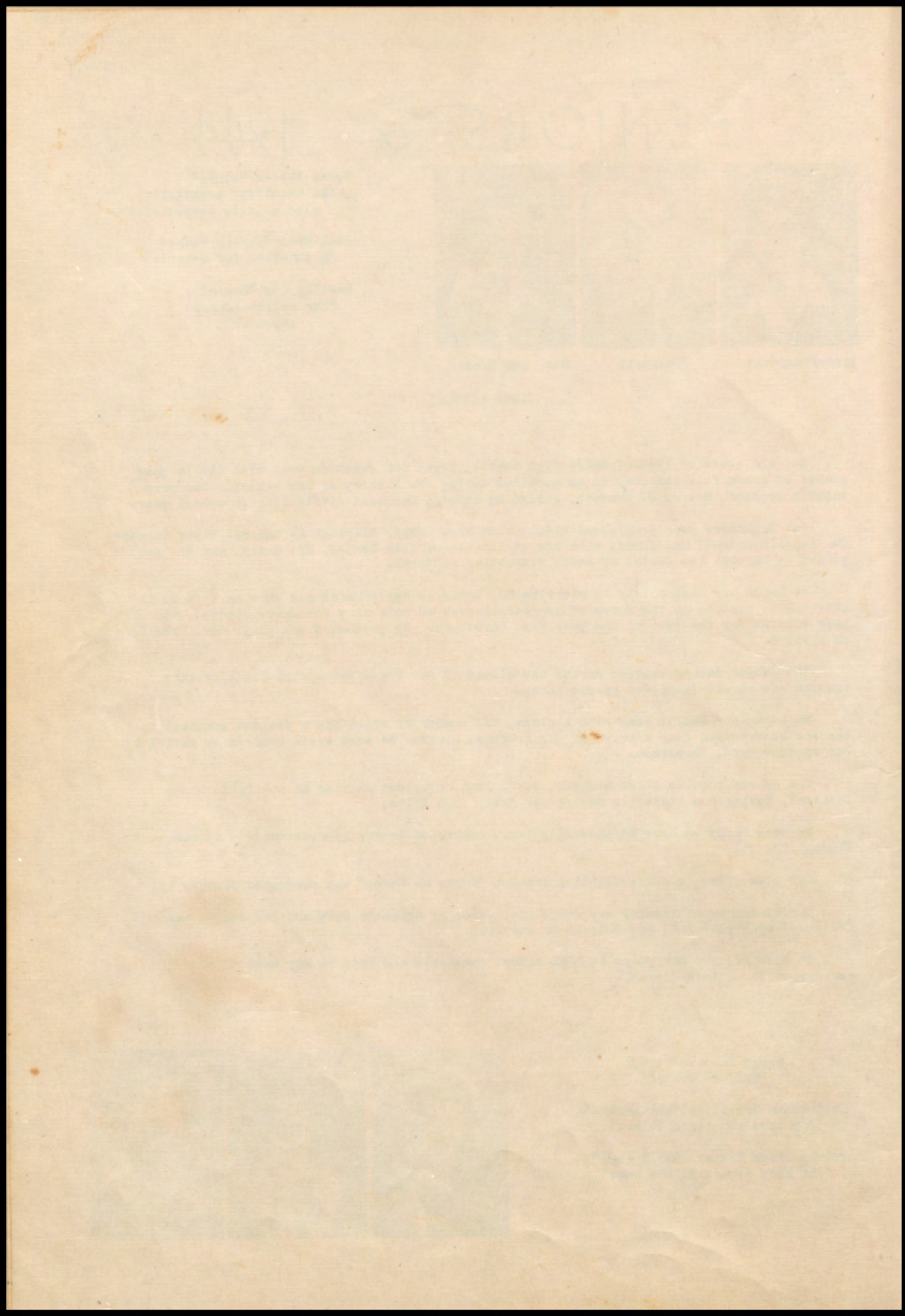
